## **Interviewing Tips for Employers**

The most successful technique in adding dimension to superficial answers lies in employing a behavioral interview format. Such questions as: "tell me about a time where you confronted an unexpected problem," "tell me about an experience when you failed to achieve a goal," and "give me a specific example of a time when you managed several projects at once."
